A vibrant revamped logo, new fonts, a bold colour palette and big bright imagery - all individual components of our exciting brand refresh that we believe will help us to better communicate all that Truro Cathedral is about.

Over the past few years, Truro Cathedral has undergone many changes and, in the past eighteen months, has been through a process to ask challenging questions of itself to define what Truro Cathedral is, what it is trying to achieve, who it is for and how it hopes to achieve what it sets out to do.

This process led to the creation of the cathedral's vision: To create sacred space in which the holiness of God is encountered in an open and inclusive way and; common ground where issues shared by the whole of humanity can be explored. But how does a brand refresh link to this? If we think about brand not just as our logo, or our name, but rather what a visitor or customer thinks of when he or she hears 'Truro Cathedral', it becomes clearer. Our brand is everything that the world knows about and experiences of us - both factual (e.g. a big pointy church in the city centre) and emotional (e.g. a spiritual, welcoming place). When we looked at the plethora of worship, events, activities, learning, outreach and more that Truro Cathedral undertakes, we soon realised our branding was far from able to communicate the varied and enriching experiences people have of this special place. And so, we have brought those elements closer together.

Introducing our new logo...



sacred space, common ground

Whilst the rose window is an intentional link to the previous logo, respecting the heritage and history of the organisation, we have incorporated lots of new, core colours. The dark blue holds fast to our traditional colour and represents the overarching umbrella of the cathedral. The removal of the solid line circling the window also adds to the feeling of openness and welcome. The individually coloured elements of the inner window represent the different areas of work that the cathedral undertakes - from worship and music to learning and events - all of which combine to 'make' Truro Cathedral the wonderful place it is. We've incorporated a condensed version of our vision too, 'SACTEA SPACE, COMMON Ground'. The font choice here is intentionally closer to handwriting, reflecting the engaging, human side of the organisation. After all, people are at the heart of all we do and so we believe it is key that they are part of our core brand.

What else is changing?

From this point, you'll start to see the new brand elements applied to cathedral communications. You'll notice different fonts, a range of colours, some vibrant new imagery depicting lots of people engaging with the cathedral, and, over time we hope you'll notice a more consistent approach which helps to immediately identify an activity, be it worship, a learning event or concert, as 'Truro Cathedral'. The change won't happen overnight – costs have been kept to an absolute minimum and, supporting this, items will only be updated to the refreshed brand when they are at a point of natural replenishment.

Perhaps for many, one of the most exciting and long anticipated developments linked to this work is the creation of a new website for the cathedral. This will be live by Easter and will provide a much improved online visitor experience, complete with searchable 'What's on' function.

This brand refresh offers an opportunity to confidently and coherently present all that Truro Cathedral is and does to its varied audiences. If we are to achieve our long-term goals, we have to be sure that when people think of Truro Cathedral, positive experiences of 'sacred space, common ground' come to their hearts and minds too. Our vision is an ambitious one - but this exciting refresh places us one step closer to achieving it.

Rose Robinson – Brand & Web Design Buzz Interactive LLE Photography John Freddy Jones – Video & Photography Not only did January mark the start of another exciting year, but with the completion of the second phase of the physical roof works, it also heralded the halfway point for our five-year Roof Appeal!

Our cathedral's existing roof has been in place since the original roof was slated around 130 years ago. Over that time the roof and original slates have deteriorated to the point they all need replacing – hence our fiveyear, £3.2 million project to undertake the works needed to protect our cathedral.


In October 2014 and November 2016, the cathedral received two grants of £500,000 each from the government's World War I Centenary Cathedral Repair Fund, and since the public launch of the Roof Appeal in July 2015, over £400,000 has been kindly donated. This brings the current total to £1.4m and leaves just over £1.7m to raise.

July 2016 marked the completion of Phase I of the physical works - the re-slating of the high level western arm which saw the replacement of almost 22,000 slates. We were also able to make use of the scaffold and incorporate the replacement of the slates on the North Aisle too – ultimately saving money. Due to the fundraising progressing well, Phase II work started in June 2017.

Commenting on the completion of this most recent segment of work, Izaak Hudson, our cathedral architect said: "Phase II was a particularly interesting phase from an architectural perspective and encompassed the re-slating of the south nave aisle, the baptistry, the western aisle of the south transept and the narthex. The baptistry roof in particular with its conical shape was fascinating to work on and involved highly-experienced roofers undertaking lots of mathematical calculations! We're thrilled with the final result."

So far 30,230 of the 60,000 slates have been replaced - A significant milestone which marks the completion of the whole of the roof of the western side of the cathedral.

The planned third and final phase will replace all slates on the eastern arm of the cathedral. It is hoped that all physical works will complete in 2020, but this is, of course, dependent on securing the remaining funds needed. Much work continues to be undertaken to inspire financial support from a range of sources for this essential project.


Bach's Mass in B Minor

The Piano Recitals are free, with a collection for Truro Cathedral Music, supporting music in the cathedral, including Truro Cathedral Choir.


Remember Our Child

Choral Evensong: Live from Truro Cathedral on BBC Radio 3



WEDNESDAY 11 JULY AT 15:30

An opportunity to take a seat and be part of the BBC's famous outside broadcast programme.

Live Choral Evensong has been running for a staggering ninety two years since it was first broadcast from Westminster Abbey on 7 October 1926. On 11 July, Evensong with Truro Cathedral Choir will be broadcast.
