From the Canon Precentor

A very warm welcome to our Sung Eucharist, whether you are joining us in person, or whether you are joining us online via the live stream. A special welcome also to the Revd Canon Jeff James who is the president and preacher at this morning's service. He is no stranger to us at the cathedral as he is one of our emeritus canons, a regular member of the congregation and officiates regularly at some of our weekday services.

Tuesday 2nd November is All Souls' Day when we traditionally pray for the Departed. There will be a simple (said) Requiem at 9 am in St Mary's Aisle and a Solemn Requiem with cantor in the nave at 5.30 pm. If you would like the name of any departed loved ones or friends to be read out during the service, please email their names to info@trurocathedral.org.uk. For those without access to email names can be submitted in person via the volunteers at the west door of the cathedral or via the vergers. Please submit names by the 31st October.

Concern is currently being expressed within the media about the rate of Coronavirus transmission within the UK. As a precaution please remember to wear a face mask at all times, to sanitise hands often and to maintain a social distance while in the cathedral (and elsewhere!).

Due to illness among the choristers, the service this morning will be sung by the Lay Vicars and Choral Scholars of the cathedral choir. Half term begins after Evensong and next week we welcome St Mary's Singers who will be singing the services.

The last Organ Recital of the 2021 series will take place on Friday at 1.10 pm. The recitalist will be Christopher Gray our Director of Music. Please do come along. The 2022 series will begin as usual next March.

There is a subtle change to service times next week. The 8 am service will be at 9, the 10 am Sung Eucharist will be at 11 and Evensong, usually at 4 pm will be at 5 pm. Alternatively, please remember to put your clocks back an hour on Saturday night as winter officially begins and Greenwich Mean Time is observed!

Second Reading
Hebrews 7: 23-28

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

The former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office; but he holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues for ever. Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them. For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens. Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself. For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect for ever.

who has spoken through the prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come.
