From Canon Elly

Welcome to Truro Cathedral for this sung Eucharist for the 4th Sunday of Easter. As we continue our walk through the joyful season of Easter, we continue to ponder the great gift that God has given us in the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. It always gives me a tingle in the back of my neck when I invite a congregation to respond to the acclamation "Alleluia Christ is Risen" with a resounding "He is risen indeed, Alleluia!" – the more enthusiastically the better, in my view! No matter what our personal circumstances and even at those times when the world around us seems to be shot through with all manner of threat and darkness, we can still, with Christians around the world, say (and sing!) 'Alleluia' whenever we have the opportunity at this time of year. Of course, 'Alleluia' is an appropriate response to God's love for us at all times of the year, but in the Easter season it resonates particularly strongly, I always feel. Indeed, every Sunday is an 'alleluia Sunday' as I once pointed out to a congregation when we sang 'Jesus Christ is Risen today' on the Sunday after Easter (having been deprived of the opportunity on Easter day itself!). We celebrate the resurrection of our Lord on every Sunday of the year – but especially are we called to do so during the Easter season. I hope you enjoy the Easter 'alleluia's' as much as I do.

To say, sing or shout 'Alleluia' in every way we can think of is, of course, one of the ways in which we respond to the outpouring of God's love for us, manifest in the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead. Another very significant way in which we can respond to this love, is to give – to give of our time, our talents and our money in the service of God and God's work in God's world. In today's service we welcome again Judith Field, the Cathedral's fund-raising lead, who will be speaking to us briefly about opportunities available to us to respond in this way in support of the financial needs of Truro Cathedral at this time. We are particularly seeking funding for repairs to the roof of St Mary's Aisle, which as many will know, is now leaking badly. So today, all of us are invited to take this opportunity, as we reflect on God's great Easter gift to us, to review our response, both in the singing and saying of 'Alleluia' and in the generosity of our giving.

The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading
Acts 9: 26-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

When he had come to Jerusalem, he attempted to join the disciples; and they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple. But Barnabas took him, brought him to the apostles, and described for them how on the road he had seen the Lord, who had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken boldly in the name of Jesus. So he went in and out among them in Jerusalem, speaking boldly in the name of the Lord. He spoke and argued with the Hellenists; but they were attempting to kill him. When the believers learned of it, they brought him down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus.

Meanwhile the church throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria had peace and was built up. Living in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it increased in numbers.

Now as Peter went here and there among all the believers, he came down also to the saints living in Lydda. There he found a man named Aeneas, who had been bedridden for eight years, for he was paralyzed. Peter said to him, "Aeneas, Jesus Christ heals you; get up

and make your bed!" And immediately he got up. And all the residents of Lydda and Sharon saw him and turned to the Lord.

Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, "Please come to us without delay." So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, "Tabitha, get up." Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.
