## ABOUT THIS SERVICE

Welcome to Truro Cathedral. It is with great rejoicing that we are able to hold public worship this Christmas. Nevertheless please note that certain precautions will still have to be observed:

- Unless you live in the same household please ensure that you observe the social distancing regulations at all times, especially when choosing a seat or queueing for communion.
- In keeping with current regulations please wear a face mask while in the cathedral.
- In order to minimise movement around the cathedral the service will be conducted from a nave altar which will be situated in the Crossing.
- Communion can only be received in one kind (the consecrated bread).
- Please follow the guidance of the stewards and vergers when going to receive Holy Communion. Please also ensure the 2 metre distancing when queueing to receive communion.
- It is currently unclear whether singing is a cause of transmission of the COVID-19 virus. Until the scientific evidence indicates otherwise and permission is given, regrettably the service will be unable to contain congregational hymns.
- To minimise physical contact, the Peace will not be shared.
- Please make every effort to support the cathedral at this financially difficult time. A collection plate will be available at the back of the cathedral and a contactless donation point can be found in the north aisle.
- Although printed orders of service are available in the cathedral, you are invited to download the order of service onto your mobile phone, ipad or other electronic device.

Gluten free hosts are available for those who need them. Please have a word with a verger before the service if you require gluten free.

All who usually receive Holy Communion in their own church are warmly invited to do so today. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please bow your head as a signal to the minister.

We wish you a joyful and peaceful Christmas and pray that you will know the presence of the incarnate Christ in your hearts and lives.

We have this Ring of Light to remind us of the coming of Jesus,  
the Light of the world.

*The central candle is lit and the president says*

We light this candle to celebrate the birth of Christ,  
for his light shines in the darkness,  
and the darkness will never overcome it.

## The Liturgy of the Word

**First Reading**  
Isaiah 52.7-20

A reading from the prophecy of Isaiah

How beautiful upon the mountains  
are the feet of the messenger who announces peace,  
who brings good news,  
who announces salvation,  
who says to Zion, 'Your God reigns.'

Listen! Your sentinels lift up their voices,  
together they sing for joy;  
for in plain sight they see  
the return of the LORD to Zion.  
Break forth together into singing, you ruins of Jerusalem;  
for the LORD has comforted his people,  
he has redeemed Jerusalem.  
The LORD has bared his holy arm  
before the eyes of all the nations;  
and all the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

*Please remain seated while the choir sings the Carol*

See amid the winter's snow,  
Born for us on earth below;

**Second Reading**  
Hebrews 1.1-4

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors  
in many and various ways by the prophets,  
but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son,  
whom he appointed heir of all things,  
through whom he also created the worlds.

He is the reflection of God's glory  
and the exact imprint of God's very being,  
and he sustains all things by his powerful word.  
When he had made purification for sins,  
he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,  
having become as much superior to angels  
as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

This is the word of the Lord.

He was in the beginning with God.  
All things came into being through him,  
and without him not one thing came into being.

What has come into being in him was life,  
and the life was the light of all people.  
The light shines in the darkness,  
and the darkness did not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.  
He came as a witness to testify to the light,  
so that all might believe through him.  
He himself was not the light,  
but he came to testify to the light.

The true light, which enlightens everyone,  
was coming into the world.  
He was in the world,  
and the world came into being through him;  
yet the world did not know him.  
He came to what was his own,  
and his own people did not accept him.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven,  
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary  
and was made man.  
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

in accordance with the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,  
and his kingdom will have no end.  
We believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the Lord, the giver of life,  
who proceeds from the Father and the Son,  
who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified,  
who has spoken through the prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.  
We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come.  
Amen.

Father, on this day your Son our Saviour  
was born in human flesh.

Renew your Church as the body of Christ and give us grace to preach  
the gospel of Christ's redemption.

*All* Holy God  
hear our prayer.

On this holy day Mary, in the pain of labour,  
brought your Son to birth.

Hold in your hand all who are in pain or distress and bring comfort  
to all who suffer in the sadness of our world.

*All* Holy God  
hear our prayer.

On this holy day the angels sang 'Peace to God's people on earth'.  
Strengthen those who work for peace and justice  
in all the world and protect with your love those who have no home  
and all who live in poverty.

*All* Holy God  
**hear our prayer.**

On this holy day strangers found the Holy Family,  
and saw the baby lying in the manger.  
Bless our homes and all whom we love this Christmas time.  
and hold in your hand all those we have known who have passed  
through death, in the hope of your coming kingdom.

*All* Holy God  
**hear our prayer.**

On this holy day angels and shepherds worshipped  
at the manger throne.  
Receive the worship we offer this day  
in fellowship with Mary, Joseph and the saints.

*All* Holy God  
**hear our prayer.**

*At the end of the prayers silence is kept and then the president says the  
following collect*

Heavenly Father,  
you have promised through your Son Jesus Christ,  
that when we meet in his name,  
and pray according to his mind,  
he will be among us and hear our prayer:  
in your love and mercy fulfil our desires,  
and give us your greatest gift,  
which is to know you, the only true God,  
and your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

**Away in a manger, no crib for a bed,  
The little Lord Jesus laid down his sweet head.  
The stars in the bright sky looked down where he lay,  
The little Lord Jesus asleep on the hay.**

**The cattle are lowing, the baby awakes,  
But little Lord Jesus no crying he makes.  
I love thee, Lord Jesus! Look down from the sky,

Close by me for ever, and love me, I pray.

Lift up your hearts.

**All We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**All It is right to give thanks and praise.**

All glory and honour be yours always and everywhere,  
mighty creator, ever-living God.

We give you thanks and praise for your Son,  
our Saviour Jesus Christ,  
who for love of our fallen race humbled himself,  
was born of the Virgin Mary by the power of your Spirit,  
and lived as one of us.

In this mystery of the Word made flesh  
you have caused his light to shine in our hearts,  
to give knowledge of your glory in the face of Jesus Christ.

In him we see our God made visible  
and so are caught up in the love of the God we cannot see.

Therefore with all the angels of heaven  
we lift our voices to proclaim the glory of your name  
and sing our joyful hymn of praise:

We praise and bless you, loving Father,  
through Jesus Christ, our Lord;  
and as we obey his command,  
send your Holy Spirit,

that broken bread and wine outpoured  
may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends  
and, taking bread, he praised you.

He broke the bread, gave it to them and said:  
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;  
do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine.  
Again he praised you, gave it to them and said:  
Drink this, all of you;  
this is my blood of the new covenant,  
which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.  
Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did,  
in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice  
made once for all upon the cross.  
Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation,  
we proclaim his death and resurrection  
until he comes in glory.

**All** Great is the mystery of faith:  
**Christ has died:**  
**Christ is risen:**  
**Christ will come again**

Lord of all life,  
help us to work together for that day  
when your kingdom comes  
and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.  
Look with favour on your people,  
gather us in your loving arms  
and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints  
to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father,  
for ever and ever.

on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those who trespass against us.  
And lead us not into temptation;  
but deliver us from evil.  
For thine is the kingdom,  
the power and the glory,  
for ever and ever.  
Amen.**

## Breaking of the Bread

*The president breaks the consecrated bread.*

We break the bread of life,  
and that life is the light of the world.  
*All* **God here among us,  
light in the midst of us,  
bring us to light and life.**

## Giving of Communion

*The president says the following invitation to communion*

God's holy gifts  
for God's holy people.  
*All* **Jesus Christ is holy,  
Jesus Christ is Lord,  
to the glory of God the Father.**

*All sit. Please follow the direction of the Lay Assistants during the distribution of communion.*

*At the distribution the minister says*

**The body of Christ.**

*The communicant replies each Amen, and then receives.*

*During the distribution the following may be sung*

fill you with joy and peace.  
Amen.**

*All* **May the Holy Spirit,  
by whose overshadowing Mary became the God-bearer,  
give you grace to carry the good news of Christ.  
Amen.**

*All* **And the blessing of God almighty,
