Welcome to Truro Cathedral and to this Eucharist. In it we recall the last meal of Christ with his friends in the Upper Room, and we recognise him in the breaking of the bread. Although our faith is grounded in history, this service is not a nostalgic looking back to the events of the past: it is a celebration that, in the Eucharist Christ is truly present to us now, and a promise of the glory that will be ours when the whole universe is made complete in him.

The service falls into four major sections:

The Gathering. We come together as God's people and prepare in penitence and joy to receive Christ in Word and Sacrament.

The Liturgy of the Word. We listen to the words of Scripture, explore the faith through the sermon and the Creed, and bring our prayers to God.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament. Bread and wine are blessed in remembrance of Christ's death and resurrection, linking his sacrifice on the cross with our offering of prayer and praise and transforming the elements of bread and wine into our spiritual food, food we are invited to share in Holy Communion.

The Dismissal. We are sent out to be the Body of Christ in the world.

Please note that communion will be administered both at the High Altar and at a Nave Station. Gluten free hosts are available at the High Altar and at the Nave Station. Please indicate to the priest if you require a gluten free wafer as you come to receive communion. All who usually receive Holy Communion in their own church are warmly invited to do so today. If you would prefer to receive a blessing, please bow your head as a signal to the minister.

Please note that intinction (dipping the wafer in the wine) is not permitted at Truro Cathedral.

Please feel free to sit or kneel at any point in the service.

The deacon invites all to confess their sins

Lord, have mercy.

Gospel Reading

All stand and turn to face the Book of the Gospels as it passes them in the procession.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit,
one God, who was, and who is, and who is to come, the Almighty.

All Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia

The deacon says

The Lord be with you.

All And also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to

All Glory to you, O Lord.

At the end the deacon says

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All Praise to you, O Christ.

Sermon

The preacher says an opening invocation or prayer, and then all sit.

The following adaptation of the Athanasian Creed is used.

This is the catholic faith: We worship one God in trinity and the Trinity in unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the divine being.

All For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Spirit is still another.

But the deity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory, coeternal in majesty.

All What the Father is, the Son is, and so is the Holy Spirit.

Uncreated is the Father; uncreated is the Son; uncreated is the Spirit.

All The Father is infinite; the Son is infinite; the Holy Spirit is infinite.

Eternal is the Father; eternal is the Son; eternal is the Spirit: And yet there are not three eternal beings, but one who is eternal; as there are not three uncreated and unlimited beings, but one who is uncreated and unlimited.

**All Almighty is the Father;
almighty is the Son;
almighty is the Spirit:
And yet there are not three almighty beings,
but one who is almighty.**

Thus the Father is God; the Son is God; the Holy Spirit is God: And yet there are not three gods, but one God.

All Thus the Father is Lord; the Son is Lord; the Holy Spirit is Lord: And yet there are not three lords, but one Lord.

The Father was neither made nor created nor begotten; the Son was neither made nor created, but was alone begotten of the Father; the Spirit was neither made nor created, but is proceeding from the Father and the Son.

**All Thus there is one Father, not three fathers;
one Son, not three sons;
one Holy Spirit, not three spirits.**

And in this Trinity, no one is before or after,
greater or less than the other;
but all three persons are in themselves, coeternal and coequal;
and so we must worship the Trinity in unity
and the one God in three persons.

**All Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy
Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be,
world without end. Amen.**

Prayers of Intercession

The intercessor introduces the intercessions.

In the power of the Spirit and in union with Christ,
let us pray to the Father.

Please sit or kneel. These responses may be used

Lord of all life or Lord, hear us.
All In your mercy, hear us. Lord, graciously hear us.

*At the end of the prayers silence may be kept and the intercessor may say the
following or another appropriate collect*

Holy God, faithful and unchanging: enlarge our minds with the
knowledge of your truth, and draw us more deeply into the mystery
of your love, that we may truly worship you, Father, Son and Holy
Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament The Peace

The president introduces the Peace with this sentence

Peace to you from God our heavenly Father.
Peace from his Son Jesus Christ who is our peace.
Peace from the Holy Spirit, the life-giver.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All And also with you.

The deacon says

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Offertory Hymn

The Offertory Hymn is sung during which the altar is prepared and a financial collection is taken for the mission and ministry of the cathedral.

Preparation of the Table Taking of the Bread and Wine

Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you.

All And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All We lift them to the Lord.

It is indeed right, our duty and our joy,
always and everywhere to give you thanks,
holy Father, almighty and eternal God.

For with your only-begotten Son and the Holy Spirit
you are one God, one Lord.

All that you reveal of your glory,
the same we believe of the Son
and of the Holy Spirit, without any difference or inequality.

We, your holy Church, acclaim you,
Father of majesty unbounded,
your true and only Son, worthy of all worship,
and the Holy Spirit, advocate and guide.

Three Persons we adore,
one in being and equal in majesty.

And so with angels and archangels,
with cherubim and seraphim,
we sing for ever of your glory:

Please remain standing as the president continues

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness;
grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit,
and according to your holy will,
these gifts of bread and wine
may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed,
took bread and gave you thanks;
he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:
Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper
he took the cup and gave you thanks;
he gave it to them, saying:
Drink this, all of you;
this is my blood of the new covenant,
which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Do this, as often as you drink it,
in remembrance of me.

The deacon says

Christ is the bread of life:

**All When we eat this bread and drink this cup,
we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus,
until you come in glory**

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross,
his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world;
rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension,
and looking for his coming in glory,
we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving,
we bring before you this bread and this cup
and we thank you for counting us worthy
to stand in your presence and serve you.

Send the Holy Spirit on your people
and gather into one in your kingdom
all who share this one bread and one cup,
so that we, in the company of the Blessed Virgin Mary
and all the saints,
may praise and glorify you for ever,
through Jesus Christ our Lord;
by whom, and with whom, and in whom,
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father,
for ever and ever.

All Amen.

Please remain standing

The Lord's Prayer

Let us pray to the Father in the power of the Spirit,
in the words our Saviour has taught us

**All Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come;
thy will be done;
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power and the glory,
for ever and ever.
Amen.**

Breaking of the Bread

The president breaks the consecrated bread.

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

All **Though we are many, we are one body,
because we all share in one bread.**

Giving of Communion

The president says the following invitation to Holy communion.

God's holy gifts
for God's holy people.

All **Jesus Christ is holy,
Jesus Christ is Lord,
to the glory of God the Father.**

Please follow the direction of the Lay Assistants during the distribution of Holy communion.

At the distribution the following is said.

The Body of Christ.
The blood of Christ

The communicant replies each time Amen, and then receives.

The choir sings the Agnus Dei followed by an anthem.

All Thanks be to God.

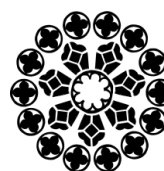
