The Ordination of Priests





29th June 2024 10.30 am

ABOUT THIS SERVICE

Welcome to Truro Cathedral and to this service in which the Bishop of St Germans will ordain people to the office of Priest in the Church of God. Those ordained priest are given authority to lead the worship of God's people in word and sacrament, to watch over them and care for them, to absolve and bless them in the name of the Lord, and to preside at the celebration of the Eucharist. They are also a sign of the priestly vocation and ministry of the whole Church, lay and ordained, to be the people of God, called by him out of darkness into his own marvellous light. This is in order to proclaim his mighty acts, and to join with Christ in his eternal high priestly prayer for the world he came to save.

The service begins with the Bishop's greeting and an act of penitence which shows our unworthiness of any ministry or calling. After the three Bible readings and the sermon, in which we can reflect on Christ's call to serve him as part of the royal priesthood of his Church, the candidates are presented and the Bishop asks the ordinands to declare their faith and commit themselves publicly to the ministry of priest. They are then commended to the prayers of the congregation and the ancient hymn 'Veni Creator' is sung.

The Bishop begins the solemn prayer of ordination over the ordinands, in the centre of which he lays hands on each of them in turn with the words:

Send down the Holy Spirit on your servant N., for the office and work of a priest in your Church.

For the laying on of hands, the Bishop is joined by other priests, which expresses the collegiality of the priesthood. The Bishop anoints the palms of each of the newly-ordained, traditionally understood as preparing them to handle holy things in the exercise of their ministry. As they rise, the stole of each, if worn, is adjusted to reflect their new office of priest.

The service continues with the liturgy of the sacrament of Holy Communion. At the end, the Bishop leads out his newly ordained priests, equipped with the Bible now presented to them, to live and work to God's praise and glory. Directions on posture are suggestions and the congregation are free to sit or kneel at any time. The congregation is invited to join in the words of the hymns and prayers written in **bold type.**

During the service, the Archdeacon will confirm that those to be ordained have taken the necessary oaths and made the Declaration of Assent. The text of this Declaration, together with its Preface, is printed below.

Preface

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-Nine Articles of Religion, The Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making Him known to those in your care?

Declaration of Assent

I, N.N., do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorized or allowed by Canon.

The Greeting

The Bishop greets the people

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Peace be with you. And also with you.

The Bishop introduces the service

God calls his people to follow Christ, and forms us into a royal priesthood, a holy nation, to declare the wonderful deeds of him who has called us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

The Church is the Body of Christ, the people of God and the dwelling-place of the Holy Spirit. In baptism the whole Church is summoned to witness to God's love and to work for the coming of his kingdom.

To serve this royal priesthood, God has given particular ministries. Priests are ordained to lead God's people in the offering of praise and the proclamation of the gospel. They share with the Bishop in the oversight of the Church, delighting in its beauty and rejoicing in its well-being. They are to set the example of the Good Shepherd always before them as the pattern of their calling. With the Bishop and their fellow presbyters, they are to sustain the community of the faithful by the ministry of word and sacrament, that we all may grow into the fullness of Christ and be a living sacrifice acceptable to God.

But first, let us remember that we are all unworthy of Our Lord's calling and to minister in his name.

Please kneel or sit. A period of silence is kept after which all say

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault. We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

The Bishop says

Almighty God, who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in life eternal; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Please stand

The choir sings the Gloria from Schubert's Mass in G (1797-1828)

God our Father, Lord of all the world, through your Son you have called us into the fellowship of your universal Church: hear our prayer for your faithful people that in their vocation and ministry each may be an instrument of your love, and give to your servants now to be ordained the needful gifts of grace; through our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.** Please sit

First Reading Acts 12:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

About that time King Herod laid violent hands upon some who belonged to the church. He had James, the brother of John, killed with the sword. After he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded to arrest Peter also (this was during the festival of Unleavened Bread). When he had seized him, he put him in prison and handed him over to four squads of soldiers to guard him, intending to bring him out to the people after the Passover. While Peter was kept in prison, the church prayed fervently to God for him.

The very night before Herod was going to bring him out, Peter, bound with two chains, was sleeping between two soldiers, while guards in front of the door were keeping watch over the prison. Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared and a light shone in the cell. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him, saying, "Get up quickly," and the chains fell off his wrists. The angel said to him, "Fasten your belt and put on your sandals." He did so. Then he said to him, "Wrap your cloak around you and follow me." Peter went out and followed him; he did not realise that what was happening with the angel's help was real; he thought he was seeing a vision. After they had passed the first and the second guard, they came before the iron gate leading into the city. It opened for them of its own accord, and they went outside and walked along a lane, when suddenly the angel left him.

But the Lord stood by me and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. So I was rescued from the lion's mouth. The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and save me for his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

When Jesus came into the district of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" And they said, "Some say John the Baptist, but others Elijah, and still others Jeremiah or one of the prophets." He said to them, "But who do you say that I am?" Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God." And Jesus answered him, "Blessèd are you, Simon son of Jonah! For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father in heaven. And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it.

"I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven, and whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven."

All remain standing while the Gospel procession returns. The preacher says an opening invocation or prayer, and then all sit.

The Creed *Please stand*

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The congregation sits and those to be ordained remain standing

The Liturgy of Ordination

The Presentation

The Archdeacon presents each ordinand to the Bishop, saying Reverend Father in God, I present N. to be ordained to the office of priest in the Church of God; he/she is to serve in the parish(es) of N.

The Bishop asks the Director of Ordinands

Have those whose duty it is to know these ordinands and examine them found them to be of godly life and sound learning?

They reply **They have**.

Do they believe them to be duly called to serve God in this ministry?

They reply **They do.**

The candidates turn to the Bishop who says

Do you believe that God is calling you to this ministry?

The ordinands reply I do so believe.

The Bishop says

I invite the Archdeacon to confirm that the ordinands have taken the necessary oaths and made the Declaration of Assent.

The Archdeacon replies

They have duly taken the Oath of Allegiance to the Sovereign and the Oath of Canonical Obedience to the Bishop. They have affirmed and declared their belief in 'the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness'.

The ordinands stand before the Bishop. The congregation remains seated.

The Declarations

The Bishop addresses the congregation

Priests are called to be servants and shepherds among the people to whom they are sent. With their Bishop and fellow ministers, they are to proclaim the word of the Lord and to watch for the signs of God's new creation. They are to be messengers, watchmen and stewards of the Lord; they are to teach and to admonish, to feed and provide for his family, to search for his children in the wilderness of this world's temptations, and to guide them through its confusions, that they may be saved through Christ for ever. Formed by the Word, they are to call their hearers to repentance and to declare in Christ's name the absolution and forgiveness of their sins.

With all God's people, they are to tell the story of God's love. They are to baptise new disciples in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, and to walk with them in the way of Christ, nurturing them in the faith. They are to unfold the Scriptures, to preach the word in season and out of season, and to declare the mighty acts of God. They are to preside at the Lord's table and lead his people in worship, offering with them a spiritual sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. They are to bless the people in God's name. They are to resist evil, support the weak, defend the poor, and intercede for all in need. They are to minister to the sick and prepare the dying for their death. Guided by the Spirit, they are to discern and foster the gifts of all God's people, that the whole Church may be built up in unity and faith.

The Bishop addresses the ordinands directly

We trust that long ago you began to weigh and ponder all this, and that you are fully determined, by the grace of God, to devote yourself wholly to his service, so that as you daily follow the rule and teaching of our Lord and grow into his likeness, God may sanctify the lives of all with whom you have to do.

And now, in order that we may know your mind and purpose, you must make the declarations we put to you.

Do you accept the Holy Scriptures as revealing all things necessary for eternal salvation through faith in Jesus Christ?

Ordinands: I do so accept them.

Will you be diligent in prayer, in reading Holy Scripture, and in all studies that will deepen your faith and fit you to bear witness to the truth of the gospel?

Ordinands: By the help of God, I will.

Will you lead Christ's people in proclaiming his glorious gospel, so that the good news of salvation may be heard in every place?

Ordinands: By the help of God, I will.

Will you faithfully minister the doctrine and sacraments of Christ as the Church of England has received them, so that the people committed to your charge may be defended against error and flourish in the faith? Ordinands: **By the help of God, I will.**

Will you, knowing yourself to be reconciled to God in Christ, strive to be an instrument of God's peace in the Church and in the world? Ordinands: **By the help of God, I will.**

Will you endeavour to fashion your own life and that of your household according to the way of Christ, that you may be a pattern and example to Christ's people?

Ordinands: By the help of God, I will.

Will you work with your fellow servants in the gospel for the sake of the kingdom of God?

Ordinands: By the help of God, I will.

Will you accept and minister the discipline of this Church, and respect authority duly exercised within it?

Ordinands: By the help of God, I will.

Will you then, in the strength of the Holy Spirit, continually stir up the gift of God that is in you, to make Christ known among all whom you serve? Ordinands:**By the help of God, I will.**

The congregation stand and the ordinands turn to face them.

The Bishop says to the congregation

Brothers and sisters, you have heard how great is the charge that these ordinands are ready to undertake, and you have heard their declarations. Is it now your will that they should be ordained? It is.

Will you continually pray for them? **We will.**

Will you uphold and encourage them in their ministry? **We will.**

The ordinands turn back to face the Bishop, who addresses them

In the name of our Lord we bid you remember the greatness of the trust that is now to be committed to your charge. Remember always with thanksgiving that the treasure now to be entrusted to you is Christ's own flock, bought by the shedding of his blood on the cross. It is to him that you will render account for your stewardship of his people.

You cannot bear the weight of this calling in your own strength, but only by the grace and power of God. Pray therefore that your heart may daily be enlarged and your understanding of the Scriptures enlightened.

Pray earnestly for the gift of the Holy Spirit.

All kneel and a time of silence is kept.

Veni Creator All remain kneeling

A cantor begins the Veni Creator



Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire, And lighten with celestial fire; Thou the anointing Spirit art, Who dost thy sevenfold gifts impart;

The Litany

In all times of sorrow; in all times of joy; in the hour of death, and at the day of judgement, Good Lord, deliver us. By the mystery of your holy incarnation; by your birth, childhood, and obedience; by your baptism, fasting and temptation, Good Lord, deliver us.

By your ministry in word and work; by your mighty acts of power; and by your preaching of the kingdom, Good Lord, deliver us.

By your agony and trial; by your cross and passion; and by your precious death and burial, Good Lord, deliver us.

By your mighty resurrection; by your glorious ascension; and by the sending of the Holy Spirit, Good Lord, deliver us.

For Philip and Hugh our bishops; that all members of the Church may serve you in their vocation and ministry; and for Andy, Stephen, and David, to be ordained priest; grant us the grace of your Holy Spirit to live our lives according to your holy word.

Holy God, holy and strong, holy and immortal, have mercy upon us.

The Bishop concludes the litany with the following collect

Lord, you are merciful and forgive our sins. You hear those who pray in the name of your Son. Grant that what we have asked in faith we may obtain according to your will; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Ordination Prayer

The congregation and the ordinands remain kneeling.

The following chant is sung quietly by all



As the singing continues, the Bishop stretches out his hands towards the ordinands, and says

We praise and glorify you, almighty Father,

because in your infinite love you have formed throughout the world a holy people for your own possession,

a royal priesthood, a universal Church.

We praise and glorify you

because you have given us your only Son Jesus Christ

the image of your eternal and invisible glory,

the firstborn of all creation and head of the Church.

We praise and glorify you that by his death he has overcome death; and that, having ascended into heaven, he has given his gifts abundantly, to equip your holy people for the work of ministry for the building up of the body of Christ.

And now we give you thanks that you have called these your servants, whom we ordain in your name, to share as priests in the ministry of the gospel of Christ, the Apostle and High Priest of our faith, and the Shepherd of our souls.

Therefore, Father, through Christ our Lord we pray:

Those priests assisting in **Andy's** ordination come to stand near him as the cantor sings the following words

Come, Holy Spirit, from heaven shine forth With your glorious light, Veni Sancte Spiritus. Come Father of the poor, come generous Spirit. Come light of our hearts, Veni Sancte Spiritus.

The bishops and the assisting priests lay their hands upon the ordinand, and the ordaining bishop says

Send down the Holy Spirit on your servant **Andy** for the office and work of a priest in your Church.

The assisting priests step back a little and those priests assisting in the ordination of **Steve** come to stand near him as the cantor sings the following words

Come from the four winds, O Spirit, come, breath of God; Disperse the shadows over us, renew and strengthen your people. Veni Sancte Spiritus. Father of the poor come to our poverty. Shower upon us the seven gifts of your grace. Be the light of our lives, O come. Veni Sancte Spiritus.

The bishops and the assisting priests lay their hands upon the ordinand, and the ordaining bishop says

The Ordination of Priests

Send down the Holy Spirit on your servant *Steve* for the office and work of a priest in your Church.

The assisting priests step back a little and those priests assisting in the ordination of **David** come to stand near him as the cantor sings the following words

You are our only comforter, peace of the soul. In the heat you shade us; in our labour you refresh us, And in trouble you are our strength. Veni Sancte Spiritus. Kindle in our hearts the flame of your love that in the darkness of the world it may glow and reach to all for ever. Veni Sancte Spiritus.

The bishops and the assisting priests lay their hands upon the ordinand, and the ordaining bishop says

Send down the Holy Spirit on your servant **David** for the office and work of a priest in your Church.

The assisting priests return to their places as the cantor sings the following words

Come, Holy Spirit, from heaven shine forth With your glorious light, Veni Sancte Spiritus. Come Father of the poor, come generous Spirit. Come light of our hearts, Veni Sancte Spiritus.

The chant continues as the Bishop continues the Prayer

Through your Spirit, heavenly Father, give these your servants grace and power to proclaim the gospel of your salvation and minister the sacraments of the new covenant. Renew them in holiness, and give them wisdom and discipline to work faithfully with those committed to their charge.

In union with their fellow servants in Christ, may they reconcile what is divided, heal what is wounded and restore what is lost.

May they declare your blessings to your people; may they proclaim Christ's victory over the powers of darkness, and absolve in Christ's name those who turn to him in faith;

The chant ceases as the Bishop concludes

so shall a people made whole in Christ offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to you, our God and Father, to whom, with the Son and the Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and for ever. **Amen.**

Please sit

The Anointing

The choir sings "If ye love me" whilst the Bishop anoints the hands of the newly ordained priests, saying quietly to each

May God, who anointed his Christ with the Holy Spirit at his baptism, anoint and empower you to reconcile and bless his people.

> If ye love me, keep my commandments. And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may bide with you for ever; even the Spirit of truth.

Music: Thomas Tallis (c 1505–85)

Text: St John 14: 15–16

After each has been anointed, they stand. The Archdeacon changes the stole from Deacon position (around the left shoulder) to Priest (around the neck)

The Giving of the Bible

The Bishop gives the Bible to each newly-ordained priest, saying

Andy, Steve, David, receive this book.

When all have received the Bible, the new priests face the congregation and the Bishop continues This is a sign of the authority given you this day to preach the gospel of Christ and to minister his holy sacraments.

The new priests turn back to face the Bishop.

The Welcome

Please stand

God was in Christ, reconciling the world to himself, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation. We welcome you as an ambassador for Christ: let the word of Christ dwell in you richly.

The congregation greets the new priests with applause.

The Liturgy of the Eucharist The Peace

God has made us one in Christ. He has set his seal upon us, and as a pledge of what is to come has given the Spirit to dwell in our hearts.

The peace of the Lord be always with you. **And also with you.**

The deacon says

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

Preparation of the Table

The Offertory Hymn is sung during which the altar is prepared and the collection is taken.

Hymn

Great is thy faithfulness, O God my Father; there is no shadow of turning with thee; thou changest not, thy compassions, they fail not; as thou has been, thou forever wilt be.

The Eucharistic Prayer

The Bishop says

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.** Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord.** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

It is indeed right and good, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks and praise through your Son Jesus Christ, our great high priest. He was lifted up for us on the cross that he might reveal your glory and draw all people to himself. You exalted him to your right hand on high and through your Holy Spirit you sent upon your people a rich diversity of gifts. From this royal priestly people you raise up ministers to proclaim your word, to care for your people and to be the stewards of your holy mysteries. You call them to serve the world your Son redeemed and build up his body the Church to be his bride. Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and singing:

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son. On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you.

He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Deacon: Great is the mystery of faith: Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again. Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with the Blessed Virgin Mary, St Peter, St Paul, and all the saints to feast at your table in heaven. Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Giving of Communion
