Choral Festal Eucharist For Pentecost



Welcome to Truro Cathedral for this celebration of *Pentecost*, The feast upon which the disciples were transformed and empowered by the Holy Spirit to become the bearers of good news throughout the world. Without this day, and the work of those disciples, we may not have known the message of love and hope beyond the grave offered by Jesus Christ, or experience the transforming power of the Holy Spirit for ourselves. *Pentecost* is also known by its English traditional name of *Whitsunday* or *Whitsun*. This feast was originally a Jewish harvest festival, taking place fifty days after Passover (hence the *Pente* in the name). In the Jewish tradition it was also called the *Feast of Weeks*. (It is now often called *Shavuot*) and was a harvest festival.

There are many reasons to celebrate today. Jesus promised us another Advocate, the Comforter, the Holy Spirit before he ascended into heaven. The creed affirms that "We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lifegiver". Without the breath of the Holy Spirit within us, we would be like dead bones. God's Holy Spirit offers us more than simply breath and physical life: The Holy Spirit grows fruit within us; love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, self-control and goodness; God's Holy Spirit brings us healing and helps us pray and communicate better with God and with each other.

At this service there will be an opportunity for anointing with Chrism oil (the consecrating oil used at confirmations, ordinations and even coronations). Chrism contains perfume of Myrrh, Cassia, Cinnamon and Calamus. The recipe for this is given in the bible. A simple prayer for renewal will be used. Please take the opportunity to be anointed, even if you do not normally receive Holy communion. Pause for a moment and experience the love and power of God's Holy Spirit.

All baptised Christians are welcome to receive Holy communion at this service. Please come for a blessing if you do not wish to receive for any reason. Intinction, (the dipping of the wafer) is not permitted for hygiene reasons.

Please feel free to sit or kneel at any point in the service.

Sermon

The preacher says an opening invocation or prayer, and then all sit.

Affirmation of Faith

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth. of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead. and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and everlasting God, through Jesus Christ, your only Son our Lord. This day we give you thanks because in fulfilment of your promise you pour out your Spirit upon us,

filling us with your gifts, leading us into all truth, and uniting peoples of many tongues in the confession of one faith.

Your Spirit gives us grace to call you Father, to proclaim your gospel to all nations and to serve you as a royal priesthood. Therefore we join our voices with angels and archangels, and with all those in whom the Spirit dwells, to proclaim the glory of your name, for ever praising you and singing:

Please remain standing as the president continues

Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, and as we follow his example and obey his command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us his body and his blood;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying:

Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of your kingdom, and with this bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

The deacon says

Great is the mystery of faith:

Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of your divine majesty, renew us by your Spirit, inspire us with your love and unite us in the body of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise.

Blessing and honour and glory and power

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

Rejoicing in God's new creation, let us pray with confidence as our Saviour has taught us

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation; but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Breaking of the Bread

The president breaks the consecrated bread

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

Giving of Communion

The president says the following

Alleluia. Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us.

Therefore, let us keep the feast. Alleluia!

After you have received the sacrament there will be ministers with oil of Chrism oil (with perfume symbolising the sweet fragrance of the Holy Spirit) standing in the aisles. Please use this opportunity to receive anointing with oil and a short prayer of blessing and renewal.

Please follow the direction of the Lay Assistants during the distribution of communion

At the distribution the following is said

The Body of Christ.
The blood of Christ

The communicant replies each time **Amen**, and then receives
