
Royal British Legion Service of Remembrance 2025



Welcome to this service in which 'We remember them'

A tradition arose in the British military that the drums of the regiment could be stacked and form a temporary altar in the field. The Chaplain would lead services from the drumhead altar. Today, the Drumhead Altar sits at the centre of the cathedral, wreaths will be laid at it and during the two minutes silence, poppies will be dropped from the tower on it.

Remembrance Sunday is a most important time. We gather to honour those who have gone before us, those who gave their lives in active service and those who are still in the field serving God, King and Country.

Thank you for being here today.

Before the service commences 3.00pm

- Participants gather and take their seats
- The congregation remains seated as the Parade of Service, ex-Service, Cadets and other organisations enter the Cathedral.
- The congregation remains seated as members of the Civic Procession are escorted to their seats at the front of the Nave.

At 3.12pm

- The Parade Marshall instructs the participants to **stand**.
- The Dean leads the Lord Lieutenant, the High Sheriff and the Under Sheriff to their seats on the South side of the Nave.

A reading from the Gospel of St John,
