Who are Luxmuralis?

'Luxmuralis' is the name given to the artistic collaboration of Peter Walker Sculptor and David Harper Composer, who specialise in immersive fine art, light and sound installations around the UK and abroad, creating works across multiple media and presentation formats.

Core to their work is the exploration and development of fine art tradition through new media and place contemporary fine art, light and sound production in an art historical context. Luxmuralis takes art onto the streets and provide access to visual artwork in public as well as unexpected places.

Developed from the concept of "Son et Lumiere" the fully curated immersive fine art experiences combine the qualities of light and sound through contemporary media and years of experience as fine artists.

Credited for creating 'the stained glass windows of our time', Luxmuralis brings stories to life through an understanding of art historical context of such institutions and painting with light the architecture, not for artifice or to simply animate, but to evoke and engage and take audiences on emotive journeys in some of the most remarkable buildings around.

Fine art, light and sound reflects closely on the history, heritage and art history of unique places and brings together the contemporary and the ancient. More than a light show, Luxmuralis create contemporary exhibitions whose core is always close to the sense of place.

Which experience by the Luxmuralis team will be held at Truro Cathedral?

Space. A visual spectacular which allows viewers to go on a journey through space and time and gave them the chance to walk amongst the stars against the incredible backdrop of the architecture of Truro Cathedral.

Who are the artists?

Lead artist and Artistic Director: Peter Walker mrbs frsa

As a sculptor and artist Peter's work adorns towns and cities both nationally and internationally. His artwork consists of large-scale sculpture, commissioned and bespoke



sculptural works as well as paintings, drawings, film, sound, and light installations. Peter has vast experience in artistic direction / project management and large-scale project development. Peter is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts, and a member of the Royal Society of British Sculptors.

Why is Truro Cathedral displaying 'Space' by Luxmuralis?

Truro Cathedral is committed to expand its offering of exciting events for the community of Cornwall, and to engage and welcome new audiences. Luke Jerram's artwork 'Gaia' was exhibited at the cathedral in 2023, and the cathedral welcomed thousands of visitors. This installation is the next offering in this programme.

Is it appropriate for a light installation like this to be in a building that exists for Christian worship?

Truro Cathedral was built by the people of Cornwall, for all people. It is a community space that warmly welcomes everyone – regardless of faith.

Luxmuralis created the first ever model and method introducing such unique installations inside the interiors of cathedrals and sacred spaces – paving the way for such spaces to be transformed and encouraging new audiences to engage with artwork as well as the space it envelops. Audiences are immersed in a fine art experience that brings such ancient monumental and sacred spaces to life. Viewers become part of the artwork as they physically journey through the spectacular sound and light which is described as 'evocative and powerful' by hundreds of thousands who have experienced shows by Luxmuralis.

The Very Reverend Simon Robinson Dean of Truro says "This amazing artwork reminds yet again of the movement of the Holy Spirit in the lives of humanity, the light shining into the darkness is a deeply theological principle about the life of Jesus Christ.
